Parish Health Ministry (PHM)

The three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. They are deeply connected to our Catholic social teachings and can be beautifully tied to our contemporary social justice issues. As we continue on our journey to Easter, may we put into practice these pillars.

Prayer: Racism & Human Dignity

The first Pillar: Prayer calls us to communion with God and solidarity with others.

Social Justice Connection: The USCCB reminds us that racism is a sin and a violation of human dignity.

Prayer becomes a way to open our hearts to conversion, asking God to heal divisions and strengthen our commitment to justice.

Scripture: "There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:28)

Reflection: Prayer is not passive—it shapes our conscience. When we pray for racial justice, we commit ourselves to dismantling prejudice and building communities of belonging.

Fasting: Care for Creation & Climate Justice

The second Pillar: Fasting teaches discipline, detachment, and solidarity with those who suffer.

Social Justice Connection: Choosing to fast from overconsumption—whether food, energy, or waste; echoes Pope Francis' call in *Laudato Si'* to care for our common home. Fasting becomes an act of ecological justice, reducing harm to the poor who are most affected by climate change.

Scripture: "Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice... to share your bread with the hungry?" (Isaiah 58:6-7)

Reflection: Fasting reminds us that our choices impact others. By living simply, we stand in solidarity with vulnerable communities and honor God's creation.

Almsgiving: Immigration & Refugee Support

The third Pillar: Almsgiving is generosity expressed in concrete action.

Social Justice Connection: The USCCB consistently defends the dignity of immigrants and refugees, urging Catholics to welcome the stranger. Almsgiving can mean supporting resettlement programs, parish outreach, or advocacy for humane policies.

Scripture: "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." (Matthew 25:35)

Reflection: Almsgiving is more than charity—it is justice. When we give to support immigrants and refugees, we embody Christ's mercy and affirm the human dignity of those seeking safety and hope.

Together, these three pillars—Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving—remind us that Lent is not only about personal renewal but also about transforming society. Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving become pathways to justice, mercy, and peace.

Our Mental Health Ministry has placed take home cards in the pew with scripture verses referencing the 3 Pillars of Lent for you to ponder and when possible put into expression.

May this year's Lenten Journey motive us to begin that inner transformation leading us to Holy Week.

GRIEF SHARE Returns to SJN March 3rd 2026

Losing a loved one changes everything. The emptiness, the loneliness, the sense that life has been turned upside down can feel overwhelming. If you've experienced this kind of loss, we want you to know:

You're not alone, and there is help available.

We invite you to join our GriefShare group beginning on Tuesday March 3. Session is from 10-11:30am. If evening hours work better for you please call Tonianne. If enough interested individuals would prefer an evening session one can be added.

Grief Share is a 13 week program. It is built around a 3-part design. Each session will show a short 20-30-minute video. There would then be a small group discussion with opportunity to talk about information shared in the video and/or any challenges you may be experiencing. There is no expectation that you need or must share in the group discussion. You may choose to just listen if that is what feels right for you at that time. Each participate will be asked to donate \$10 towards purchase of the workbook, SJN will cover the additional \$10 for each book, you may take notes in workbook during the video or reflect on some of the short exercises and journal prompting with scripture passages in between the sessions. 

A "Christian Who Cares" & A Call to a Holy Lent

On February 7-8, our parish was blessed to welcome Nathan Crankfield from the

Hallow app, who shared a powerful testimony at all the Masses about the profound impact Fr. Dan had on his life. Nathan described Fr. Dan as a "Christian who cares." That genuine, faithful care, lived out in relationship, helped shape the course of Nathan's life in a lasting way. Fr. Dan had the privilege of confirming Nathan into the Catholic Church, and Nathan spoke movingly about how becoming Catholic and committing to a life of prayer changed the trajectory of his life. His story was a beautiful reminder that accompaniment matters. When we walk with one another in faith, God does extraordinary things.

As we begin our Lenten journey, Nathan's witness points us back to the heart of the season: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. When we hunger, whether for food, technology, or comfort, it can remind us that Jesus is the Bread of Life: "I am the bread of life.

Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." (John 6:35). Fasting teaches us that only God can truly satisfy our deepest hunger. But Lent calls us to more than giving something up. It also invites us to take something on, especially a deeper commitment to prayer and charity. Through our parish partnership with Hallow, there are many ways to grow in prayer this Lent, including daily Gospel reflections, the Rosary, prayers with the saints, and Night Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours. Almsgiving, too, opens our hearts. Almsgiving is not only about donating money; it can mean offering our time, serving those in need, and recognizing Christ in them. As Jesus tells us in Matthew 25:40, in serving the least, we serve Him.

If you haven't yet chosen your Lenten sacrifice or made a plan for your family, it's not too late. Ask the Lord how He is inviting you to pray more deeply, fast more intentionally, and love more generously this Lent. Let this be the season that changes your trajectory, too.


