As you are probably aware, a group consisting of myself and seven parishioners will be going on a mission trip to our sister parish, St. Francis of Assisi, in the Dominican Republic in April. As is usual, we will be collecting needed items to bring with us and religious crafts for the children. Collection bins will be marked in the Narthex and your help for crafts will be requested in the bulletin and our blog. As always, all on this trip are very grateful for the work our parish does behind the scenes!

Sadly, this year I have another request for a married father of four children who I have known for 23 years. This man, Chao, takes his vacation time when we are in

the Dominican Republic so he can drive us, our supplies, and clean water and ice to the locations from which we will be working each day. He, unfortunately, has developed back injuries-- his job requires lifting supplies on and off a truck, a problem with his liver, probably as a result of nutrient deprivation, in addition to, several more minor problems. It is not known how long he will be unemployed and, of course, he is without medical and/or employment compensation. I have been able to obtain some funds presently but it is uncertain when he can return to work and, if he will have a job to return to, when he is able to work. If you are able to share some monetary assistance, I know it would be greatly appreciated. You can use an envelope marked Chao and place it in the collection boxes or bring it to the office.

As always, I am always grateful for the generosity of this parish!

Winter Health Tips: Caring for Body and Spirit

Winter invites us into a season of quiet, reflection, and renewal — but it also brings cold temperatures, fierce winds, icy conditions, and the need for extra care. Supporting our health in these months is both a

practical responsibility and a spiritual act of stewardship. As St. Paul reminds us, “Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you...?” (1 Corinthians 6:19). Tending to our well-being honors the gift God has entrusted to us.

Stay Warm and Layer Wisely

Cold temperatures can strain the body, especially for older adults or those with chronic conditions.

Stay home, if possible, on extremely cold days. Keep indoor temperatures safe and consistent. Do not use a stove as your heating means, keep space heaters at least 4 feet from walls and other household furnishings.

If outings are necessary, plan errands for midday when temperatures are warmest. Wear loose light weight layers with an insulating middle layer that trap heat. If involved with strenuous activity- shoveling or outdoor exercise do not wear cotton fabrics but rather wear a synthetic material as it will wick moisture away. Remember to cover your head, hands, and feet; these are areas where heat escapes quickly.

“She is not afraid of snow for her household, for all her household are clothed in scarlet.” (Proverbs 31:21)

A reminder that preparation is an act of love.

Nourish our Body

Winter often brings dry air, less sunlight, and changes in appetite. Drink water regularly, even when you don't feel thirsty. With the dryer air we can easily dehydrate ourselves without awareness. Use skin moisturizers. Choose warm, nutrient-rich foods like soups, whole grains, and winter vegetables. Consider vitamin D-rich foods to support mood and immunity.

“So whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God.” (1 Corinthians 10:31)

Keep Moving

Shorter days can make it tempting to stay still, but gentle movement supports circulation, mood, and overall health. Stretch throughout the day. Exercise indoors; Try simple chair exercises if mobility is limited; or take short outdoor walks. Combat the winter blues with social connections. Call a family member or friend; Coordinate an outing. “In Him we live and move and have our being.” (Acts 17:28)

Practice Winter Safety

Slippery sidewalks and icy steps are common hazards.

Wear shoes with good traction. Use animal safe salt or sand on walkways if unable to shovel. Keep a small emergency kit in your car with blankets, snacks, and a flashlight.

“The prudent see danger and take refuge.” (Proverbs 22:3)

Care for Self and One Another

Prevent cold related injuries by pacing self if doing any outdoor activities; watching for signs of hypothermia- shivering, numbness in extremities, pale skin color and confusion. Warm oneself up, come out of cold, use warm blanket and focus on warming core body first. Prevent spreading germs by washing hands often, get vaccinated, stay home when ill. Winter can be isolating. A quick check-in can make a world of difference. Call neighbors or parishioners who live alone. Offer help with errands or snow shoveling. Pray for those struggling with heating costs or seasonal depression.

“Bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ.” (Galatians 6:2)

Winter reminds us that God is present in every season; even the quiet, cold ones. Caring for our health is a way of preparing room for His peace. As the psalmist says, “The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore.” (Psalm 121:8)

SAINT ANGELA MERICI (c. 1474-1540)

January 27

Born in Northern Italy, orphaned in childhood, Angela Merici faced a society in which education was largely the privilege of wealthy young men and based primarily in monastic schools. This reality shaped Angela's insightful conviction that society's disorder was caused by disorder in the home, and a lack of model Christian mothers the result of neglecting the education of young women. Transform the Christian family by placing an educated wife and mother at its heart, Angela believed, and the whole world would be renewed in Christ! So she gathered a small group of unmarried women, many of them Franciscan

Tertiaries (lay affiliates) like herself, and set out to educate poor girls, free of charge, in their homes. She and her band of teachers called themselves

"companions," pioneering a new form of non-cloistered religious life for women, bearing witness to evangelical simplicity in the midst of the world, not as a formal "order" but as the "Company (compagnia) of Saint Ursula." Known today as the Ursulines, Angela

Merici's spiritual daughters continue serving the Church and society in a rich diversity of ministries.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The prayers surrounding baptism often speak of being "clothed in Christ," and clothes are an important consideration. In ancient times, adults were probably baptized without any clothes at all, and old texts survive asking people to leave fancy garb and jewelry behind as they enter the font. Baptism was typically in a private place, the community waited elsewhere, and the casting off of clothing was hardly a public moment, nor was it embarrassing in ancient cultures where privacy was largely unknown.

Nonetheless, what was left behind on one side of the font was replaced on the other as a white robe was wrapped around the newly baptized. It was a robe of honor, a dazzling sign of a new beginning for a society that valued clothing as a sign of personal identity. For the newly baptized, a whole week in white garments was the rule, through the second Sunday of Easter, called "Sunday in Albus," because of all the folks wearing their baptismal robes.




