

October is ADHD Awareness Month

ADHD, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, is a neurodevelopmental disorder and one of the most common mental health disorders affecting children, though it does affect people of all ages. ADHD affects millions of children and adults, it doesn't look the same in everyone.

Understanding how ADHD presents differently in boys and girls, and later in men and women, can help the PCP diagnose it in a timely manner as well as assisting families, educators, and caregivers. This diagnosis gives insight and helps us all respond with understanding, acceptance, and compassion.

In Psalm 139, we're reminded: "I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made." ADHD doesn't diminish a person's worth—it's part of the unique way God has knit each of us together. Whether we're parenting a child with ADHD, navigating adult symptoms, or supporting someone in our parish, we're called to respond with patience, understanding, and hope.

Here is a list of several common symptoms seen in both children and adults with ADHD: Difficulty paying attention, forgetfulness, poor organization, restlessness, difficulty playing quietly, impulsivity, procrastination, mood swings or irritability, poor time management.

- Boys are often diagnosed earlier due to visible behaviors like hyperactivity and impulsiveness.
- Girls may struggle quietly with inattention, emotional sensitivity, and anxiety—symptoms that are less disruptive and often missed. Girls are more likely to be misdiagnosed with anxiety or depression, delaying proper support.
- Men may show impulsive behaviors like risk-taking or emotional outbursts.
- Women often battle with being overwhelmed, perfectionism, and low self-esteem—especially during hormonal shifts like pregnancy or menopause. Many women aren't diagnosed until adulthood, when symptoms intensify or caregiving demands reveal deeper struggles.

Recognizing these gender differences helps reduce stigma and ensures that individuals receive the support they need. ADHD is lifelong, but with awareness, compassion, and proper care, those affected can thrive. We know God's design is intentional. ADHD doesn't diminish a person's dignity—it's part of their unique wiring. Let us respond with patience, grace, and understanding.
