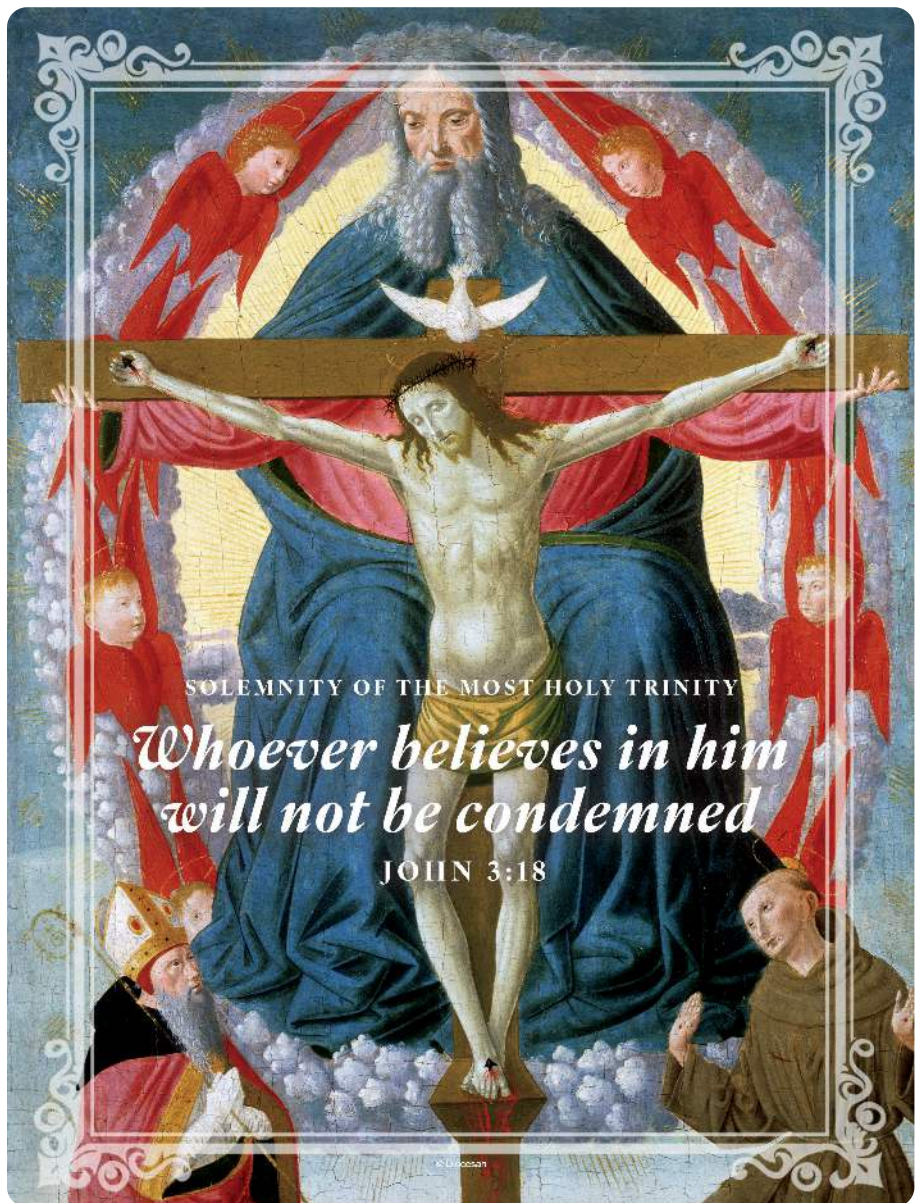

Behind the Collar: Meet Your Deacons

This week we continue getting to know the deacons who serve our parish! We asked Deacon Pete Jupin and Deacon Mike Oles about their careers and how their work connected to their call to serve the Church.

What is (or was) your main occupation, and how do you see it connecting to your call to service in the Church?

Deacon Pete Jupin: I worked many years in the human service field, spending my last 32 years at Lancaster General Health. My early years involved work in counseling and psychotherapy, but I later became a hospital chaplain. I finished my career as an oncology chaplain at the Ann B. Barshinger Cancer Institute. Over time, it became very clear to me that at the root of all human suffering — pain, sorrow, grief, addictions, anxiety, depression, relationship problems — was an underlying emptiness and hunger for God, that only God Himself could satisfy. My call to the diaconate was based on this sense that healing often comes from God, through us, to others in compassionate service.

Deacon Mike Oles: I was in the military for 20 years, then in the aerospace industry for another 14 years. I had great assignments working as a physicist on the Apollo 11 program and with many state-of-the-art technologies — but, in the end, nothing satisfied me. I hungered for more. In 1998, I had just been accepted into the Diaconate Formation Program when, at the same time, I was laid off from a job. Instead of pursuing another corporate position, I decided to stay put, continue with Diaconate Formation, and taught high school physics for four years. Once I was ordained, I decided I would let God decide what to do with me next, and I never pursued a paying job after that.

PARISH HEALTH MINISTRY (PHM)

As we close out the Month of May, where the nation focuses on Mental Health Awareness I wanted to share a Homily that Deacon Oles gave back on 4/21/26. It is shared with permission from Deacon Oles & our Priests

April 21 2026 - Deacon Oles' Homily

"In a world marked by anxiety, depression, war, uncertainty, many people are asking the same question the crowds asked Jesus: What sign can you do? They wanted proof. They wanted something immediate, visible, and powerful. They were hungry not only for bread; but for meaning.

Jesus answered them not with a spectacle, but Himself: " I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." In these words Christ speaks to every restless heart today. We live surrounded by noise, fear, and constant pressure, yet the deepest hunger of the human person cannot be filled by success, money, distraction, or power. Only Jesus can satisfy our soul. The world may feel unstable, but Christ remains steady. Families may struggle, and minds may be overwhelmed, but the Lord still offers Himself as food for the journey; In the Eucharist. He gives not an idea, but His very life. He comes to strengthen the weak, console the sorrowful, and bring peace to the troubled heart.

This is why Christian joy is possible, even now. It is not because suffering is gone, but because Christ is here. It is not because every

problem is solved, but because the Living Bread has been given to us. When we come to Him in faith. we receive a hope that does not collapse under fear.

So today, we can bring our hunger to Jesus. We can stop looking to the world for what only Christ can give. We can come to Him in prayer, in the Sacraments, and in trust. Only He , the Living Bread of Life, can bring true peace to our inner souls. We ask for the grace to receive Him, believe in Him. and live in the joy that only He can give."

Going into June a mental health awareness topic is PTSD- Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. PTSD is a serious mental health condition that can develop after an individual experiences or witnesses a traumatic event. This can include events such as combat exposure, sexual or physical assault, natural disasters, serious accidents, or the unexpected death of a loved one. PTSD can affect anyone; veterans, first responders, survivors of violence or accidents, and even those who have experienced medical or emotional trauma. Symptoms of PTSD can significantly impact daily life, relationships, and overall well-being. Many live with symptoms such as anxiety, nightmares, or hypervigilance, often in silence.

As a parish community, we are called to be a place of compassion and understanding. Christ reminds us, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." Our presence, patience, and willingness to listen can be a source of healing for those who struggle. Going into June, we pray for all who are living with PTSD, the invisible wounds of their trauma and for their families and caregivers. May they find support, hope, and the gentle peace of God.

SAINT CHARLES LWANGA AND HIS COMPANIONS (MARTYRED 1886-87)

June 3

"Master of Pages," reputedly the handsomest man in all Uganda, Charles Lwanga, lay catechist, courageously led about forty teenaged boys, Catholics and Anglicans, on a forty-mile forced march to martyrdom for their common Christian faith. Teaching each other the hymns of their different churches, they strengthened one another for the ordeal ahead. King

Mwanga, himself barely twenty, had ordered them executed for being "those who pray." But these royal pages were the king's male harem, who, now Christians, refused what pious accounts demurely describe as his "unreasonable demands." Some were clubbed to death, most burned alive; the youngest, thirteen-year old Saint Kizito, whom Charles had often shielded from the King's lust; the most tragic, Saint Mbaga, whose father was his executioner!

In 1964, Paul VI canonized the young Catholics and praised their Anglican companions, recalling the heroism of early Christianity's African martyrs, which we modern Christians of far less faith never expected to see repeated. Forty years after the pope's words, what does our faith cost us? Heroism aside, how generous is our response? —Peter Scagnelli

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD AT SJN: A FOUR-PART GLIMPSE INTO THE ATRIUM

Part 2: The Kingdom of God Grows

One of the most beautiful aspects of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is the way it honors the spiritual life already present within the child.

This spring, our Atrium children spent weeks reflecting on the Kingdom Parables: the mustard seed, the leaven, the pearl of great price, the hidden treasure, the Good Shepherd, and finally the Growing Seed. Again and again, they returned to the same wonderings:

How does the Kingdom of God grow?

Does it grow quickly or slowly?

Who helps it grow?

What is precious in the Kingdom of God?

The children explored these mysteries not through lectures, but through tactile experience and contemplation. They kneaded dough and hid yeast within flour. They planted seeds and observed wheat sprouting from what first appeared small and lifeless. They learned that growth often happens quietly and invisibly before it can ever be seen. In one presentation on the Mystery of Life and Death, children examined seeds at different stages of growth: hard seeds, softened seeds beneath the soil, green shoots, and mature wheat stalks heavy with grain. Together they listened to Jesus' words: "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." (John 12:24). The children wondered aloud: "Is the seed really gone?" "Or has it changed into something new?" These moments are at the heart of CGS. Children are trusted with profound truths because they are naturally drawn to them.

The catechist does not rush to provide all the answers. Instead, she helps create space for prayerful reflection and discovery. Over time, the Atrium becomes a place where children begin to recognize the voice of the Good Shepherd for themselves, in Scripture, in prayer, in silence, and in the liturgy of the Church.

Spending time in the Atrium is deeply meaningful not only for the children, but for the catechists as well. Walking alongside children as they encounter the Good Shepherd through prayer, Scripture, wonder, and silence is a profound gift and a continual reminder that the Holy Spirit is truly at work among us.
