February 11th is World Day of the Sick 2026:

A Call to Compassion

Each year on the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, the global Church observes the World Day of the Sick, a moment to pray for the ill, honor caregivers, and renew our commitment to compassionate service. For 2026, Pope Leo XIV has selected a theme rooted deeply in the Gospel and urgently relevant to our world:

"The compassion of the Samaritan: loving by bearing another's pain."

The theme draws from the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37)—where Jesus redefines what it means to be a neighbor. Pope Leo XIV emphasizes that true love is not an abstract sentiment but concrete, courageous action: stopping, seeing, touching, and tending to the wounded. He reminds us that compassion is not passive pity but a willingness to carry another's burden, even when inconvenient or costly.

In his message, the Pope highlights that the world continues to face profound suffering—illness, isolation, poverty, and the lingering wounds of global crises. The Samaritan's example becomes a blueprint for Christian discipleship today: To notice those who are hurting. To draw near, even when others pass by. To act with tenderness and practical care. To restore dignity to every person, especially the most vulnerable.

Pope Leo XIV urges all people of faith and goodwill to become "everyday Samaritans"—in families, parishes, hospitals, and communities. Whether through professional or family caregiving, parish outreach, or simple acts of kindness, every one of us is invited to reflect God's healing love.

This is not only a moment of prayer, but a renewed mission: to build a Church and a world where no one suffers alone, and where compassion becomes the measure of our love by drawing close to those who suffer, offering not only care but presence, dignity, and love.

Losing a loved one changes everything. The emptiness, the loneliness, the sense that life has been turned upside down can feel overwhelming. If you've experienced this kind of loss, we want you to know:

You're not alone, and there is help available. We invite you to join our GriefShare group beginning on Tuesday March 3. Session is from 10-11:30am. If evening hours work better for you please call Tonianne if enough interested individuals would prefer an evening session one can be added.

Grief Share is a 13 week program. It is built around a 3-part design. Each session will show a short 20-30-

minute video. There would then be a small group discussion with opportunity to talk about information shared in the video and/or any challenges you may be experiencing. There is no expectation that you need or must share in the group discussion. You may choose to just listen if that is what feels right for you at that time. Each participant will be asked to donate \$10 towards purchase of the workbook, SJN will cover the additional \$10 for each book, you may take notes in workbook during the video or reflect on some of the short exercises and journal prompting with scripture passages in between the sessions. SAINT SCHOLASTICA (c. 480-543)

February 10

What we know about Saint Scholastica is credited to the writings of her twin brother Benedict, who was a great reformer of monastic life and founder of the convent of Monte Cassino. Following the example of her brother, Scholastica founded a second monastery for women in Plombariola. Since entry to people of the opposite sex was prohibited in both communities,

Benedict and Scholastica met once a year at an intermediate point to pray and talk about spiritual life.

According to sources, when it was time to say goodbye during their last meeting, Scholastica insisted

that Benedict stay rather than returning to the convent, but he refused. Then, Scholastica implored God for her brother to remain and the response was a copious storm, such that leaving was unthinkable. Benedict recognized in this action not only the will of God, but also the request that his sister had made to the same God they loved so much. Three days later,

Scholastica was called to the eternal homeland.

Scholastica valued small things and trust in God.

We Celebrate Life!

At the recent Catholic Social Teaching Symposium, held at the Diocesan Center in Harrisburg, much of the discussion concerning human dignity and immigration revolved around the eternal wisdom of Mother Church found in the Catechism.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church 2241:

The more prosperous nations are obliged, to the extent they are able, to welcome the foreigner in search of the security and the means of livelihood which he cannot find in his country of origin. Public authorities should see to it that the natural right is respected that places a guest under the protection of those who receive him.

Political authorities, for the sake of the common good for which they are responsible, may make the exercise of the right to immigrate subject to various judicial conditions, especially with regard to the immigrant's duties toward their country of adoption. Immigrants are obliged to respect with gratitude the material and spiritual heritage of the country that receives them, to obey its laws and to assist in carrying civic burdens. We pray that all people of goodwill; officials, citizens, and immigrants will take these words to heart and conscientiously follow them in the spirit of Christ's Peace and Justice.






