

Parish Health Ministry (PHM)

A Lenten reflection from Paul Wilzak

As we approach Lent, I'm reminded of a program from my parish in Kansas City called "From Ashes to Easter". It was envisioned as a journey with Jesus. Our Parish, SJN, is about to embark on this trip with the Lord, which can be thought of as involving three steps:

1. We hear the word of the Lord in Scripture or some other source.
2. We take the word to heart and ponder its meaning.
3. We let the word come to expression in our lives.

This Journey begins on Ash Wednesday. To start our journey with Jesus, we might hear His voice in the words of our liturgy: "Remember, friend, that you are dust and into dust you will return". As we reflect on this meaning, we may be struck by how serious or even threatening these words seem. They not only imply that we will all die, which we all know in a vague way, but also put a spotlight on our mortality. When we are in that spotlight, it's very uncomfortable! Yet that was the very discomfort that our Lord accepted when He became a human being. He took on the reality of His own death and dying.

So, to walk with Jesus, we must somehow bring to expression in our lives our own acceptance or OUR deaths. But how? We might recall how Holy Father

Francis led us from Ashes to Easter last year. He celebrated with us the joy of resurrection, and on the very next day, he concluded his own earthly life. He witnessed for us to a life well-lived; a life that lives as a gift to us all. How many other people in our lives did something comparable? I lost three cousins last year, and as an 84-year-old person, I know my own day is closer than ever. But as a Pastor in Kansas City once said, "No one is too young to die". To be mortal means to be able to die at any time.

When we remember those we lost, we might ask ourselves whether, if we knew that year would be their last, we would have related to them differently. It's an important question. I once heard a wise psychologist say "Don't give a person flowers after they died. Do it while they are living!" Amen!

Hear the Word; Ponder its meaning, Express the Word in our lives.

Losing a loved one changes everything. The emptiness, the loneliness, the sense that life has been turned upside down can feel overwhelming. If you've experienced this kind of loss, we want you to know:

You're not alone, and there is help available. We invite you to join our GriefShare group beginning on Tuesday March 3. Session is from 10-11:30am. If evening hours work better for you please call Tonianne. If enough interested individuals would prefer an evening session one can be added.

Grief Share is a 13 week program. It is built around a 3-part design. Each session will show a short 20-30-minute video. There would then be a small group discussion with opportunity to talk about information shared in the video and/or any challenges you may be experiencing. There is no expectation that you need or must share in the group discussion. You may choose to just listen if that is what feels right for you at that time. Each participant will be asked to donate \$10 towards purchase of the workbook, SJN will cover the additional \$10 for each book, you may take notes in workbook during the video or reflect on some of the short exercises and journal prompting with scripture passages in between the sessions. THE SEVEN HOLY FOUNDERS OF THE ORDER OF THE SERVANTS OF MARY

February 17



Today's liturgical feast honors Alexius, Amadeo, Hugo, Benedict, Bartholomew, Gerardino and Juan. A group of merchants who renounced the business life, they left what was necessary for their families, then distributed the rest among the poor. They dedicated themselves entirely to the veneration of the Virgin Mary, going to live on an

Italian mountain and later establishing a hermitage for prayer, extreme fasting, and penance. Some time later, at the request of the Supreme Pontiff's delegate, six of the seven were ordained as priests. Brother Alejo, discerning the priesthood as something very consequential for him, decided to remain as a brother. The Congregation was approved in 1304 and the liturgical feast is held on February 17, in remembrance of the last founder's death; Brother Alexius shared a testimony of holiness, both in his own life and in the lives of his fellow companions.
