"Rise, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel." (Matthew 2:20)



SEVEN SISTERS APOSTOLATE

We will be starting women's prayer groups at Saint John Neumann Parish specifically for the intentions of Fr. Dan and Fr. Stiteler. The plan is to offer prayer for them in the form of holy hours using the simple structure created by the Seven Sisters Apostolate (Seven Sisters apostolate.org). One priest, seven women praying one hour, seven days each week.

The Seven Sisters Apostolate was started by Janette Howell in 2011. Janette sensed a "nudge" to pray more frequently and intentionally for her pastor, Fr. Joseph R Johnson in Minneapolis, MN. Since that time, the membership has grown to have at least one group praying in every state of the United States and in many countries overseas. There are groups praying for the intentions of bishops, archbishops and cardinals. There are even 8 groups praying daily, specifically for the intentions of Pope Leo IV!!

The goal of each group is to have seven women volunteering to pray a holy hour for the intentions of a specific priest one day a week. This generous commitment of prayer is ideally for a period of one year, but can remain open-ended in time as each individual senses the call to continue. The plan here at SJN is to develop a group praying specifically for the intentions of Fr. Dan initially, and then to develop a group praying for the intentions of Fr. Stiteler.

Would YOU like to be involved in this unique prayer ministry? Are you experiencing a "nudge" from the Holy Spirit?

If you are a woman who senses a call to join one of these groups, or simply would like more information about what is involved, please contact Kathy Birmingham at 717-397-8647. The hope is to start this ministry by the end of January in 2026.

Parish Health Ministry (PHM)

Today, December 28, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

We are all called to be Holy families. Our Catholic understanding of family stands as a radiant sign of unity, love, and divine purpose. Our world is marked by fragmentation and noise and sadly many see the family as mere social construct or biological arrangement. Yet, we know it is a sacred vocation, a domestic church where holiness is to be nurtured and God's love is to be made visible.


The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We are in the season of the Incarnation, the mystery of God's love poured out in Christ's birth. The word derives from the Latin carnis meaning "flesh." Throughout history, some Christians have distrusted the "flesh," and stressed a hatred of this world and its pleasures. Perhaps they have not paid enough attention to how "embodied" the sacraments are. One third-century author put it plainly in an image that may alarm diet-conscious Americans, explaining that we wash the body so the soul can be cleansed, that we anoint the body so the soul can be strengthened, and that we eat the body and blood of Christ so that "the soul can fatten on God."

Catholics "get" that God is revealed in this world. The sacraments use the "stuff" of creation: water and oil; the senses of the body, touch and taste and smell. We use the things of this world rightly. After all, God's love poured out into human flesh means the world has eternal value. Why else would Jesus describe the kingdom to come as a teeming city or a marriage banquet? Catholics are realists, and nowhere is that more evident than when we gather for a sacrament.



When Christmas Comes Quietly: Finding True Joy in His Presence

December 25 is now a few days behind us. The gifts have been opened, the special meals shared, and for many families, the long buildup to Christmas Day has finally eased. And yet, in the richness of our Catholic tradition, Christmas is not finished; it is just beginning. As I look back on December 14, when our Faith Formation families gathered in the school for a regularly scheduled meeting, I'm struck by how providential the timing was. What appeared ordinary on the calendar became something extraordinary in our hearts. As snow gently fell on white-capped trees outside, something sacred unfolded inside, a quiet moment of grace that reminded us what Christmas is truly about.

Families had the opportunity to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, to sit in the stillness of Adoration, and to spend quiet time with Jesus. As the Nativity story was read, Rousseau's Silent Night played softly in the background, creating an atmosphere of reverence and peace. Before Adoration, we listened as Nate shared the beautiful story of our faith: how Jesus was born as a baby, lived among us, showed us how to live holy lives, taught us how to love God and one another, worked miracles, and ultimately gave His life for us. Through Him, we are given a second chance to be holy, to be close to God, and to love as we were always meant to. The presence of the Holy Spirit during Adoration was unmistakable. A hushed peace filled the room, gently enveloping children and adults alike. For this overly busy, sometimes worn-out, soulweary mom, it felt like an unexpected and deeply personal gift. In that moment, I experienced genuine Christmas joy. Not the fleeting, well-meaning joy we parents sometimes try to manufacture with packed schedules, celebrations, and gifts we'll be paying off for months, but rather the deep, abiding joy that only Jesus Christ can place in a human heart. If you were present for this meeting, I pray you felt it too. As we step into the Christmas season together, may we linger a little longer with Him, allowing His peace and joy to dwell in our hearts.


