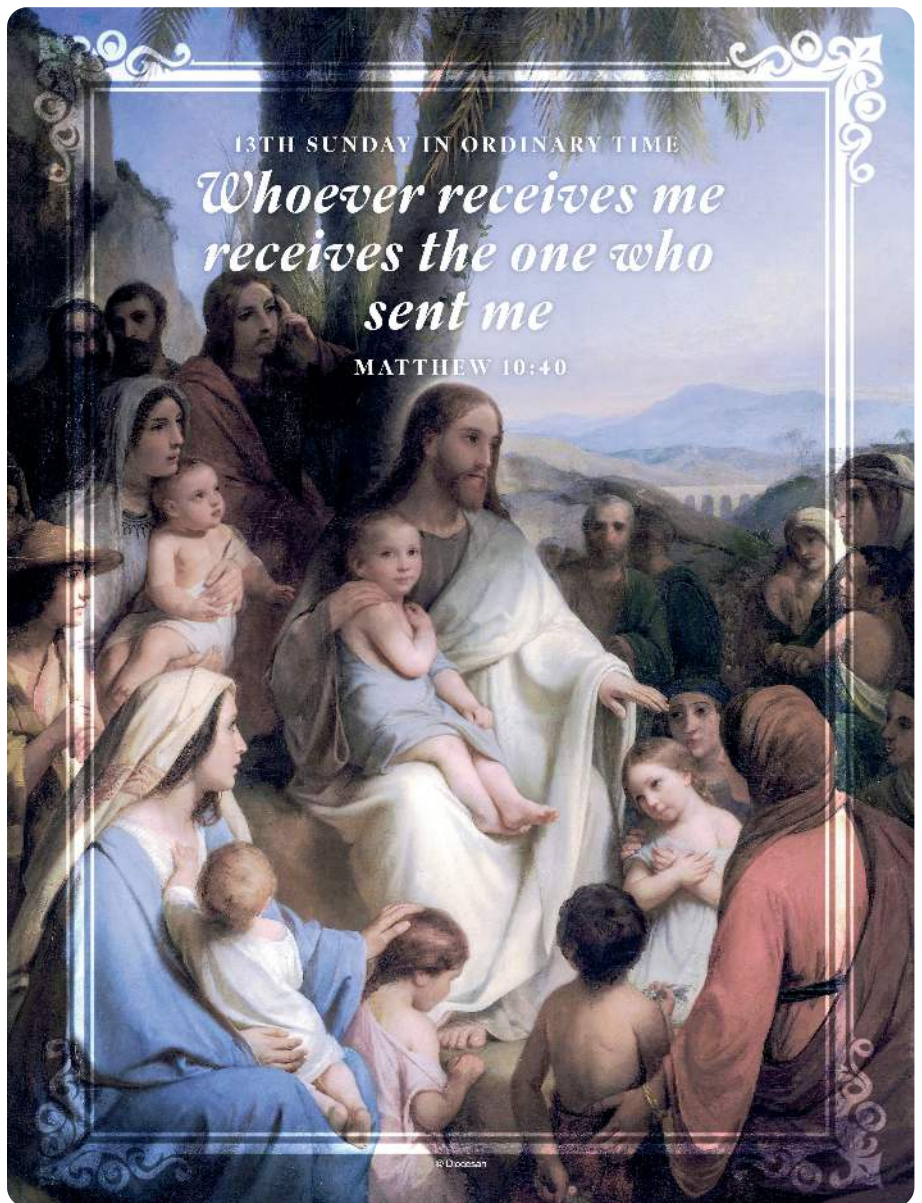

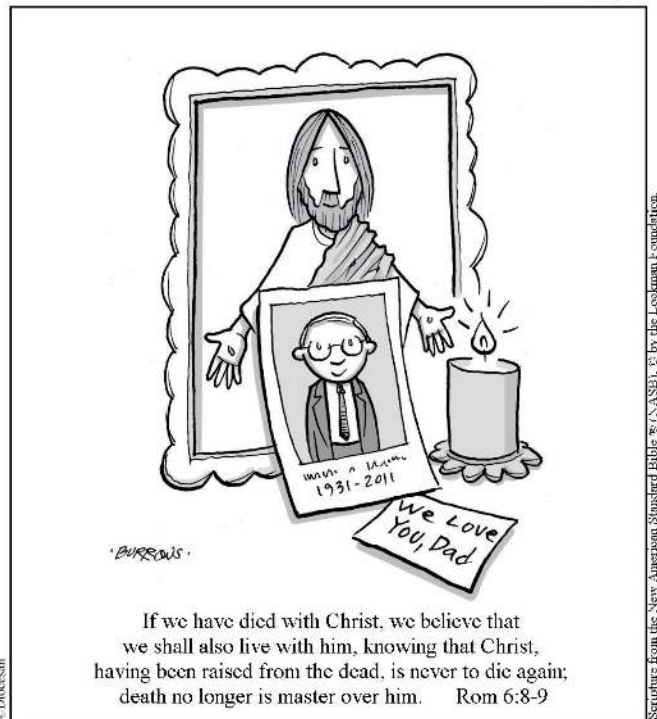

Fireworks Safety

Celebrating with Joy, Care, and Community

As we prepare to celebrate next weekend our 250th Independence Day, many of us look forward to the beauty and excitement of fireworks. But while fireworks add to the celebration, they also pose serious risks. Each year, home fireworks cause thousands of injuries, many involving children and young adults. Sparklers, which burn at about 2,000 degrees Fahrenheit, are the leading cause of emergency room visits for children under age five.

Children under 15 account for about one-third of fireworks-related emergency room visits, while adults aged 25 to 44 make up the largest share of overall reported injuries.

As a community, we can help keep one another safe by taking simple, thoughtful steps.

- Check local laws to ensure the types of fireworks are permitted in our area.
- Keep children at a safe distance; we now know even sparklers burn at extremely high temperatures.
- Wear closed toe shoes to protect feet-especially little ones using sparklers.
- Light fireworks one at a time and move back 10 +feet quickly.
- Never try to relight a firework that doesn't go off—wait, then soak it in water.
- Keep a bucket of water or a hose nearby for emergencies.
- Protect pets by keeping them indoors, where they feel safe from loud noises.
- Never aim fireworks at people, animals or other structures-aim aerials in open field direction.
- Always clean up the aftermath of the fireworks remnants.

Choosing safety is an act of responsible love for our families, friends and neighbors, when we celebrate responsibly, we honor both the gift of our freedom and the gift of one another.

However, to avoid the cost, stress and work- including clean-up; Take the family to a professional fireworks display; they remain the safest way to enjoy the holiday. Many are scheduled around the County.

If you prefer at-home fun without the risk, consider glow sticks, bubbles, or festive noisemakers.

May this upcoming Fourth of July be a time of gratitude, joy, and safe celebration for all.

Lord God, Creator of all things, guide our steps and strengthen our hearts during these months of summer and vacation days.

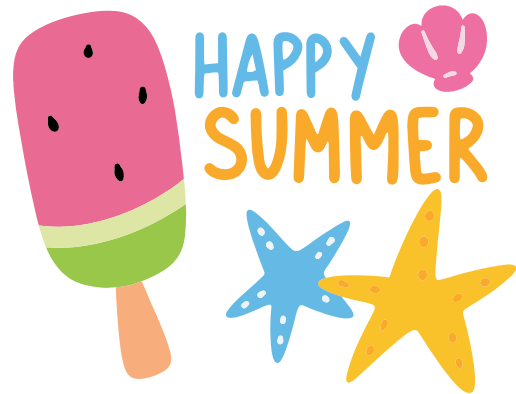

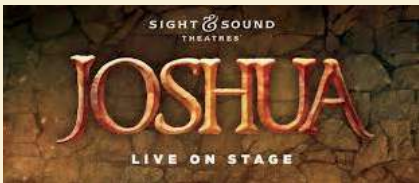

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles (June 29)

Today is an exceptional event on our calendar: the regular Sunday of Ordinary Time is eclipsed by a solemnity honoring two saints who didn't spend much time together in their earthly ministry, and who have distinct feasts so they probably don't mind sharing this one. Yet each suffered a similar fate in the same city, Rome, during the persecution of the Emperor Nero. Nero probably ordered the destruction of many of the residential neighborhoods in service to his building projects, and when the homeless began to look for someone to blame for the fires, Nero targeted the Christians. Soon, Peter was crucified, upside down, on the Vatican hill.

Excavations (called scavi) under the Vatican basilica have proven the authenticity of his burial place near the place of his death. Paul, a Roman citizen, was later granted a swifter execution by sword, and is remembered at a vast basilica on the city's outskirts.

Peter and Paul were just about polar opposites. Peter rough and ready, Paul poetic and polished. Peter carried a burden of regret for his denials, Paul had his own issues with which he struggled. Peter leapt over barriers to go to the Gentiles, Paul strove with and surrendered to the same call. True, they spent very little time together in this life, but the same Spirit filled their hearts and by their witness changed the face of the earth.

SAINT JUNÍPERO SERRA (1713-1784) July 1

No one who has stood before the quiet majesty of Mission San Juan Capistrano, or the altogether different but no less lovely Mission Dolores in San Francisco, or any of the missions from San Diego to Sonoma can fail to bless the Franciscan padre who, while not founder of each, was inspiration for them all, Blessed Junípero Serra. Abandoning the comfortable academic life to which his doctorate in theology entitled him, Serra journeyed to the New World where his tireless traveling, dramatic preaching, and penitential austerity converted thousands of native peoples. Saving souls and celebrating the sacraments were Padre Serra's



primary mission but not his only one. Education in letters and crafts, trades and agriculture transformed the people, while roads and irrigation systems transfigured the landscape. His more than thirty years of ministry were not free from conflict with authorities or without controversy in the retrospectively critical eye of history. But when John Paul II beatified him in 1988, he praised Padre Serra for assisting his converts to use their new faith to advance their true human development.

Be a Link for Jesus

These are the last two paragraphs of the Mission Discourse in the Gospel of Matthew. If we look at chapter 10 as one unit, we could hear Jesus saying to us: "I'm sending you out, giving you authority to be in the world as an extension of the mission you have seen Me carrying out: proclaiming that the Kingdom of heaven is at hand, healing, curing, raising the dead, driving out demons, teaching, loving, forgiving" (v. 1, 7).

BUT...You will find it no easier than I... If they have called me Beelzebul, then they will also call you this (v. 25). REMEMBER THIS...Everyone who acknowledges Me before others I will acknowledge before My heavenly Father (v. 32). This is the end, what we look forward to: a relationship—to stand before the heavenly Father with and in Christ!

SO...Don't control things by packing up everything so you can rely on material things for your safety. Don't move around trying to find the best situation for yourselves according to who will care for you the best. Don't plan ahead for your defense (v. 9-23).

And then three times Jesus says:

Do not be afraid (v. 26, 28, 31). I am inviting you into a relationship. I am a link, in a sense, that brings you into direct relationship with the Father who loves you and cares for you more than the sparrows. Others—mother, father, siblings—may reject you when you enter into a relationship with Me, but my Father will never leave you without his help.

AND YOU TOO ARE A LINK NOW FOR OTHERS...Be a strong link. Align yourself with Me. Do not grasp onto and preserve your identity, control, security, or self-centered desires pursued on your own terms. Instead, lose your life for My sake (v. 39), surrendering it in trust and obedience, giving up your own agenda to follow Me. Take the risk to love Me and trust Me. Only I can give you eternal life.

When you do this, you become a link for others to come to Me. When they receive you, they receive Me, and when they receive Me, they receive the one who sent Me (v. 40). Even if you just give them a dixie cup filled with cold water, this kindness from you will link them to Me (v. 42). Everyone's story will look very different, and your choices are your own as Jesus leads you. Jesus is still able to walk about reaching others and bringing them into His relationship with the Father through you.

You have been commissioned by Jesus. Who is waiting for you to become this link for them?
