60th Anniversary of World Communication Day

Today, we celebrate the 60th Anniversary of World Communications Day. Established by Pope Paul VI following the Second Vatican Council, this annual observance invites the Church to reflect on the role of media and communication in shaping human relationships and society. The 2026 theme underscores the importance of ensuring that technology supports—rather than undermines—the human voice and face.

Pope Leo XIV has chosen the theme “Preserving human voices and faces” to highlight the need for communication that remains authentically human in an age increasingly shaped by digital tools and artificial intelligence.

The Vatican’s Reflection on Technology and Communication

The Vatican notes that “In today’s communication ecosystems, technology influences interactions more than ever before—from algorithms curating news feeds to AI authoring entire texts and conversations.”

Yet it warns that such tools “cannot replace the uniquely human capacities for empathy, ethics, and moral responsibility.”

Public communication, it emphasizes, “requires human judgment, not just data patterns.” Therefore, the challenge before society is to ensure that humanity remains the guiding agent. The future of communication must be one in which machines serve as tools that connect and facilitate human lives, rather than erode the human voice.

A Call to Defend Human Dignity in a New Technological Era

Pope Leo XIV has repeatedly spoken about the profound challenges posed by emerging technologies, describing artificial intelligence as part of a “new industrial revolution.” He urges the Church to draw deeply from its social teaching to defend human dignity, justice, and labor in this rapidly changing landscape.

Today on World Communication Day spend some time reflecting on these questions:

1. Where do I see technology enhancing my ability to communicate with compassion—and where might it be diminishing genuine human connection?
2. How do I ensure that my voice, presence, and

relationships remain rooted in empathy and moral responsibility, even when using digital tools?

3. In what ways can I help preserve the “human face” in our parish, family, and workplace—especially in moments when communication becomes rushed, automated, or impersonal?
4. What aspects of Catholic social teaching can guide my own use of technology, particularly regarding human dignity, justice, and the value of human labor?
5. How might God be inviting me to use technology as a tool for communion rather than division, for clarity rather than noise, for truth rather than distortion?

May is Mental Health Awareness Month and the benefit of authentically human communication has many noted benefits and aligns beautifully with World Communication Day and our call to be disciples.

- It embodies accompaniment, making parishioners feel seen and valued.
- Builds trust faster, Human presence, eye contact, tone, body language; communicates sincerity and credibility.
- It increases clarity and reduces misinterpretation also includes nonverbal cues that enhance understanding.
- It supports mental and spiritual wellness, where tone, presence, and empathy matter deeply.
- It strengthens community resilience, especially in moments of anxiety or conflict.
- It allows us to offer faith-rooted encouragement in a way artificial intelligence & written words cannot fully match.
- Strengthens relationship and rapport; direct contact fosters empathy, connection, and a sense of being heard.
