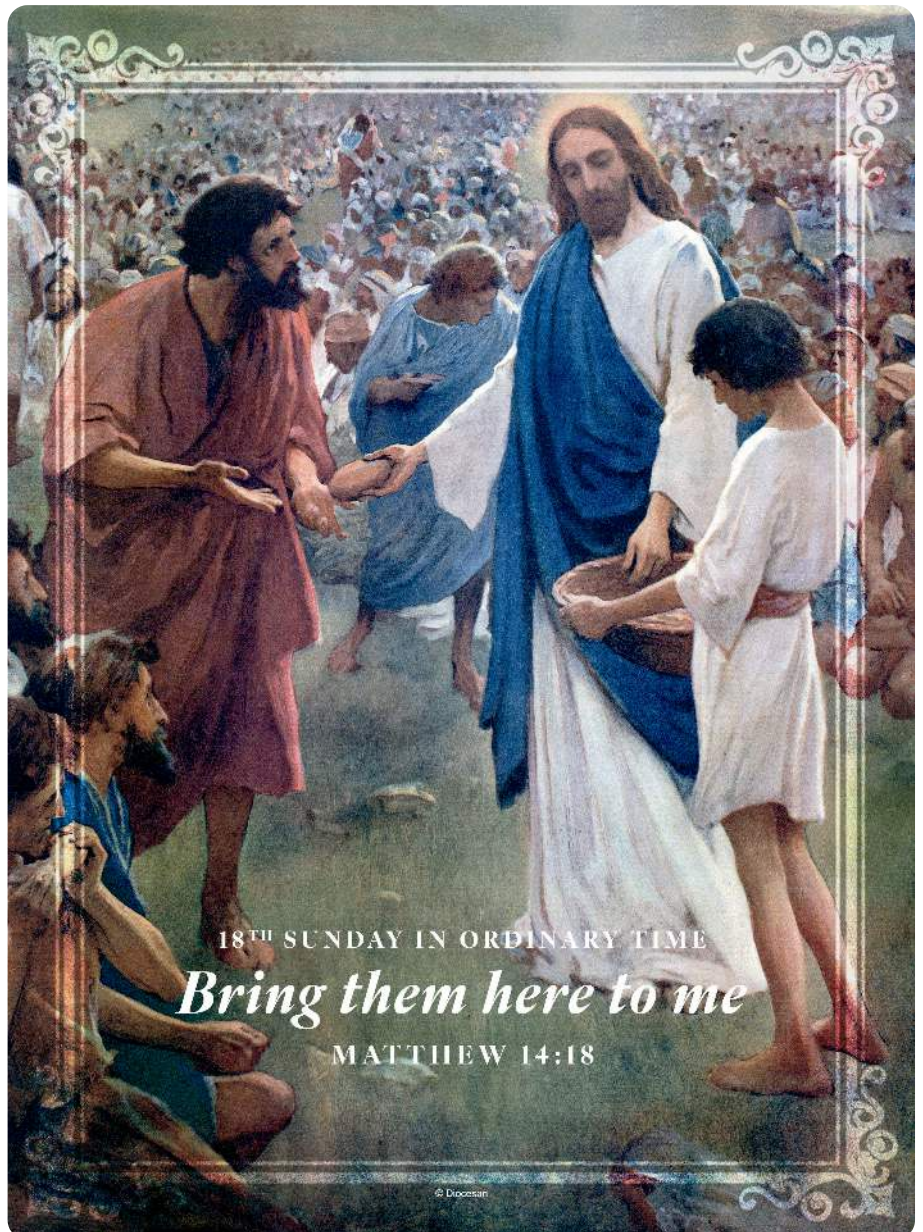

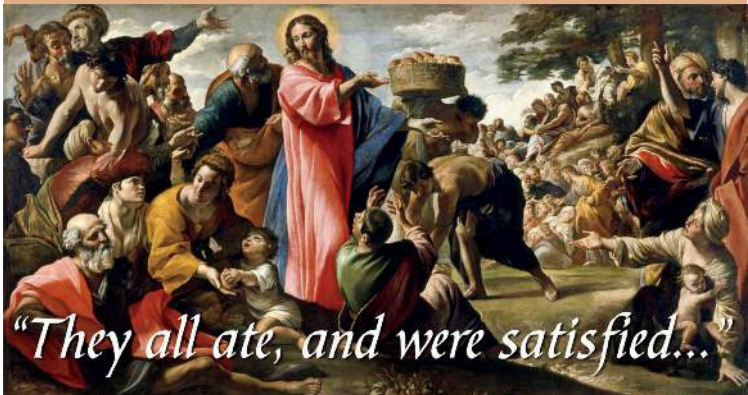

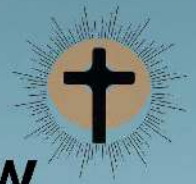

PARISH HEALTH MINISTRY (PHM)

Melanoma is the most serious form of skin cancer. The American Cancer Society estimates that in 2026, 234,680 Americans will be diagnosed with melanoma, including 112,000 invasive cases and 122,680 in situ cases (noninvasive). But when caught early, it is highly treatable. Knowing what to look for and how to reduce your risk can make a life-changing difference. This article explains the warning signs, the most common places melanomas appear, and practical steps to protect your skin every day.

What Melanoma Looks Like: The ABCDE Rule

Dermatologists use the "ABCDE" rule to help people recognize suspicious moles or skin changes. Any one of these features is a reason to have a spot checked.

- A – Asymmetry: One half of the mole doesn't match the other. Healthy moles are usually symmetrical.
- B – Border: Edges are irregular, ragged, blurred, or scalloped.
- C – Color: Multiple colors—brown, black, tan, red, white, or blue—within the same spot.
- D – Diameter: Larger than 6 mm (about the size of a pencil eraser). Note: Melanomas can be smaller when they first appear.
- E – Evolving: Any change in size, shape, color, elevation, or symptoms (itching, bleeding)

Additional warning signs: A new mole that appears after age 30. A mole that looks "different" from your others (**the ugly duckling sign**). A sore that doesn't heal. A spot that bleeds easily or becomes crusty. A dark streak under a fingernail or toenail. If you notice any of these changes, a dermatologist should evaluate the area promptly.

Melanoma can develop anywhere, even in places that rarely see the sun. On women: legs, arms, and trunk are primary areas. For Men: back, shoulders, scalp. All adults need to have soles of feet, under nails, palms, and mucous membranes checked. People with darker skin: palms, soles, nail beds (acral melanoma) are areas that need close attention. This is why full-body skin checks—either at home or with a dermatologist—are so important.

Anyone can develop melanoma, but risk increases with: fair skin, light eyes, or red/blonde hair; a history of sunburns, especially blistering burns; tanning bed use; having many moles or atypical moles; family history of melanoma; weakened immune system; living in high-UV regions or spending long hours outdoors. If you fall into any of these categories, regular skin exams are especially important.

How to Prevent Melanoma:

A. Use Sunscreen Correctly: daily sunscreen use is one of the strongest protective steps you can take.

- Choose SPF 30 or higher
- Use broad-spectrum (UVA + UVB)
- Apply 15 minutes before going outside
- Reapply every 2 hours, or after swimming/sweating
- Use enough: a shot-glass amount for your body, 1 teaspoon for your face

B. Avoid Tanning Beds: Tanning beds significantly increase melanoma risk—even one session.

C. Wear Protective Clothing:

- UPF-rated shirts
- Wide-brimmed hats
- Sunglasses with UV protection
- Shade sails or umbrellas used when outdoors

D. Seek Shade During Peak UV Hours: UV radiation is strongest between 10 AM and 4 PM.

E. Perform Monthly Skin Self-Checks: Use a mirror or ask a partner to help check your back, scalp, and hard-to-see areas.

F. Schedule Yearly Dermatology Exams: Especially if you have risk factors or notice any changing spots.

If you notice a mole that is changing, painful, bleeding, or simply looks "off," a dermatologist should evaluate it. Early detection dramatically improves outcomes.

SAINT JOHN MARY VIANNEY (1786–1859)

August 4

A busy pastor jokingly suggests the secret of John Vianney's holiness: "He died seventeen years before telephones!" Call they didn't, but visit they did, keeping Vianney eighteen hours a day in the confessional. Stories abound of reading hearts and exorcisms, but Vianney's first miracle was getting ordained. Difficulty with studies delayed him, prompting the rector's apology to the bishop, "So far to ordain just one, especially this one!" The bishop, who could not know he was ordaining the future patron saint of parish priests, replied, "No burden to ordain one good priest!" In Ars, only an elderly handful attended Mass, "praying," one told Vianney, "for a priest with brains." But he stayed forty-two years, fulfilling the promise he made the day he arrived. In a sculpture just outside the village Vianney points skyward: "Show me the way to Ars," he tells a boy, "and I'll show you the way to heaven." To someone who feared there was no heaven beyond the grave, Vianney smiled, "My child, it would have been heaven enough to have lived as Jesus' disciple on earth."

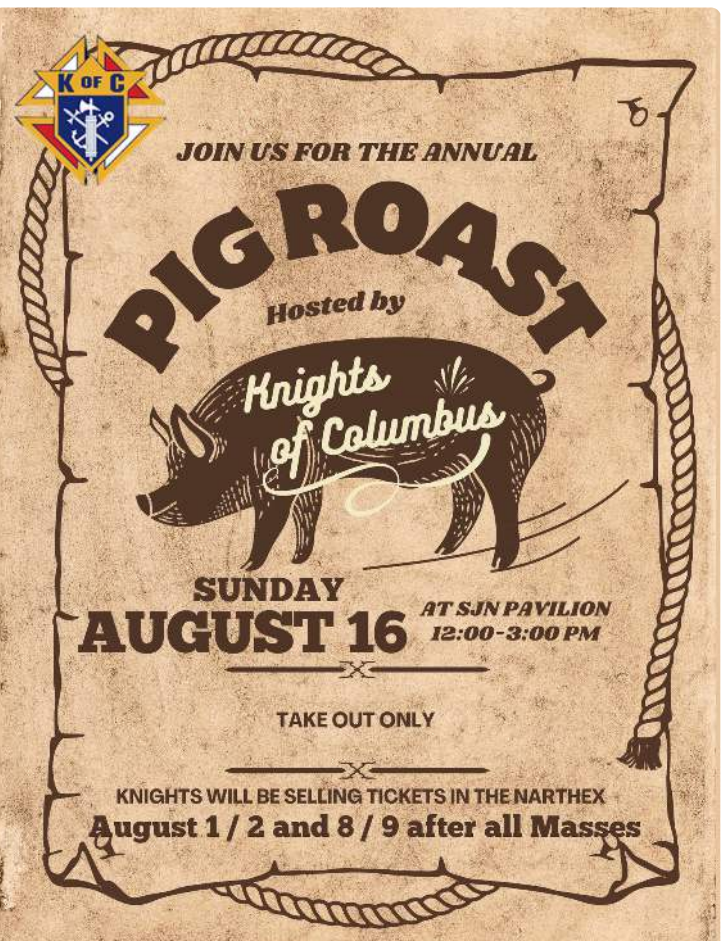
