





## Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We are faced with strong and disturbing readings today that hold a certain fascination, since they seem at first glance to be blueprints for future inevitable wars and hardship. A fundamentalist interpretation focuses on this aspect. Yet we hear them at our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, which infuses them with hope and optimism. Rather than dreading the future, today's liturgy assures us that God is with us in all of life's inevitable trials, and that we have a role in shaping the outcome of human history. Occasionally, some Christians have attempted to decode these readings for an exact measure of the world's end, but they have thus far been disappointed. "Nothing lasts forever" is a lyric from a Broadway show. Stars fall from the sky, leaves wither and fall, mountains wash into the sea, human projects and governments totter and collapse with great regularity. Today's liturgy opposes this idea as incomplete, reminding us that Christ has made a permanent change in human history, and that life in him is life forever. Rather than inviting us to throw in the towel, today's liturgy strengthens us for acts of goodness and grace in our families, communities, and world.

#### FOOD INSECURITY

In the U.S. alone, over 44 million people—including 13 million children—experienced food insecurity in 2022. The number is anticipated to be larger today, though no formal statistics are available.

In Lancaster County, nearly 50,000 people, or about one in eleven residents, face food insecurity. The USDA defines food insecurity as a household's "limited or uncertain ability to acquire adequate food due to a lack of resources."

#### **Key statistics of Lancaster County**

- Overall rate: Approximately 8.7% to 10.3% of the population is food insecure, with at least 50,000 people affected.
- Child food insecurity: The rate is higher for children, at about 1 in 8, or around 15,200 children. They are 55% more likely to be food insecure than adults.
- Racial disparities: Black and Hispanic residents are 3.5 times more likely to experience food insecurity compared to white residents.

**Impact on households:** 41% of food pantry visitors reported regularly reducing their food intake. With 44% of food pantry visitors saying they have gone hungry at least once weekly.

Causes: Income is a major factor; nearly half of food pantry patrons who work full-time earn less than \$24,000 per year. The expiration of federal aid, like SNAP emergency allotments, and ongoing grocery inflation have contributed to recent increases in the food insecurity rate.

Areas of concern: Geographic concentration: Areas along the Route 30, 222, and 283 corridors and within the City of Lancaster show higher concentrations of food insecurity. The consequences of food insecurity are farreaching:

Physical health: Malnutrition, weakened immunity, and chronic illness.

**Mental health**: Anxiety, depression, and stress from food uncertainty.

**Educational outcomes**: Children struggle to concentrate and learn on an empty stomach.

**Economic productivity**: Hunger undermines workforce performance and long-term development.

**High-need households**: Around 25,000 ALICE (Asset-Limited, Income-Constrained, Employed) households are at risk but often don't qualify for traditional food assistance programs.

Being mindful that food insecurity is not always visible, a neighbor may skip meals to feed their children; an elder may choose between groceries and medicine. In every act of kindness—every can donated, every prayer lifted—we become Christ's hands in the world.

Food insecurity is not just a statistic, it's a daily reality for millions. As people of faith, neighbors, and global citizens,

we are called to respond with empathy, advocacy, and action. Whether through volunteering, donating, or raising awareness, each of us can help ensure that no one goes hungry.

Lancaster County has various opportunities to assist in this area. The Parish Resource Center maintains a listing of area food distributions and locations of organizations that provide free meals. 



#### **OUR LADY OF DIVINE PROVIDENCE** - November 19

Together, we can ensure every mother and baby is cared for during this difficult time.

Devotion to Our Lady of Divine Providence originated in Italy in the thirteenth century, and was carried to Puerto Rico in the 1850s by Bishop Gil Esteve Tomás. The original statue at the cathedral there was eventually replaced by a wooden carving in 1920 that has become the most familiar image of the patroness of Puerto Rico.

## Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne (1769-1852)

November 18 Pope Benedict once declared himself struck by how remarkably diverse our American saints are some native born: Mother Seton, Katherine Drexel, Kateri Tekakwitha; most, like many Catholics today, immigrants: Padre Serra, Bishop Neumann, Mother Cabrini, Rose Philippine Duchesne. When the French Revolution that dispersed her convent ended, Rose joined the Religious of the Sacred Heart, volunteering for their United States mission, opening the first free school west of the Mississippi. Only after lengthy service as Superior did Rose—now seventy-one—realize her life's dream, undertaking a mission among the Potawatomi Indians. When some worried about her advanced age and failing health, the Jesuit mission leader overruled them: "She must come! She may not be able to do much work, but she'll bring the mission success by praying for us!" Frustrated by her inability to learn their languages, Rose nevertheless "spoke" to the Native Americans by her prayerful presence before the tabernacle. "Quah-kah-ka-num-ad," they named her, "Woman-Who-Prays-Always"—their way of bestowing the title the Church would later make official: saint!


